The Thompson Springs Special Service Fire District Administrative Control Board met in a regular meeting on February 16, 2021. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the meeting was attended electronically on Zoom. Members in attendance were Chair Mary McGann, Evan Clapper, Gabriel Woytek, Trisha Hedin, Kevin Walker, Sarah Stock, and Jacques Hadler. Also present were Commission Administrator Chris Baird, Associate Commission Administrator Mallory Nassau, Clerk/Auditor Quinn Hall, and Thompson Springs Fire Chief Mark Marcum.

**Incidents:** On February 1 at about midnight, there was a water line break, under a fire hydrant. Mark and the Water Master spent all night getting it to shut off. On February 5, there was a gun fired in town. On February 10, there was a medical call. On February 11, there was a vehicle rollover, on the off-ramp to Thompson. Nobody was hurt. On February 13, EMS and law enforcement were called out to mile marker 206, where a man was laying down next a horse. They discovered he was just taking a nap

**Equipment:** All equipment is functional. He will get the backup generator installed at the end of February.

**Training:** On February 9, Mark did smooth bore nozzle training.

**Other:** On February 9, they had the Thompson Springs Fire Hazard and Rejuvenation Town Hall Zoom meeting. It was fairly well attended, and Commissioners Mary and Trish attended. The Building Inspector, Health Department, and Solid Waste also attended. Local residents had good questions. Abby Scott with Planning & Zoning made some resources available on the Grand County website - maps, cleanup resources, and chipper day info (April 10).

## Chief's Report to TSSSFD Board March 16, 2021

### Recent Incidents:

- 3/4- Medical call, I-70 MM 207 (GCEMS)
- 3/6- Medical call, I-70 MM 199 (GCEMS)
- 3/9- Motor vehicle accident, I-70 MM 188 (GCEMS)
- 3/13- 2 separate, simultaneous motor vehicle accidents, I-70 MM 187 (TSFD, GCEMS, multiple law enforcement units)

### Equipment:

- All apparatus functional.
- Backup generator has been delivered but not installed.

### Training:

- 3/17- Hands on with antiquated (20 years old) TSFD "Jaws of Life" and associated tools. Concerns about safety of old high pressure hydraulic lines and equipment.

### Other:

- 2/9 - Thompson Springs Fire Hazard and Rejuvenation weekly CAT meetings continue.
- 2/16 - Thompson Springs fuel break, fire mitigation tour/meeting with "new" BLM fuels specialist. NEPA will need to be updated before work can begin.
- Attended annual S.E. Utah Interagency Wildland Fire Spring Planning meeting (virtual). Some takeaways: NWS predicts drought conditions to continue through at least June. Prolonged drought combined with monsoon associated lightning this summer could contribute to more fires. Last year the monsoons/lightning did not arrive. New Interagency Operations Center located at Ken's Lake will mean longer Federal wildland response times to north Grand County fires.
